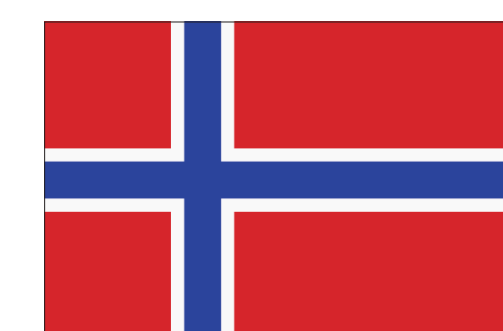
Individual scientists are encouraged to participate in the promotion of the Society and to come up with suggestions of topics which advance our common goal.

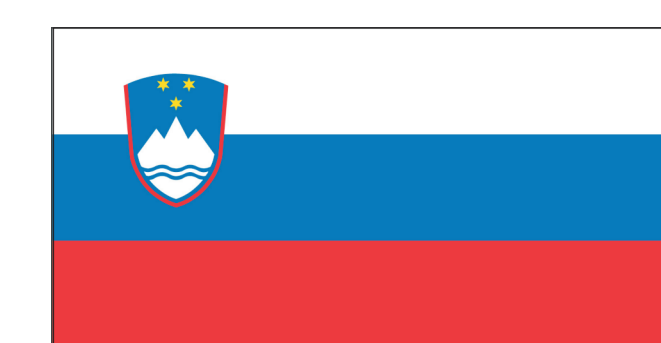
